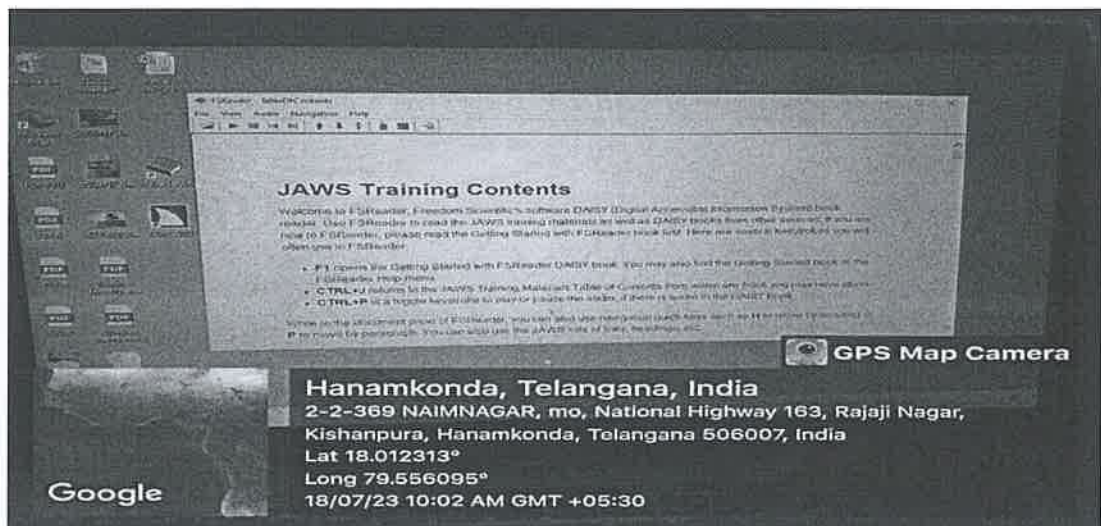

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1) Scribe Software: The institute provide the scribe software for the students who are blind and visually impaired persons to read the screen either with a text to speech output.

JAWS Setting Screen

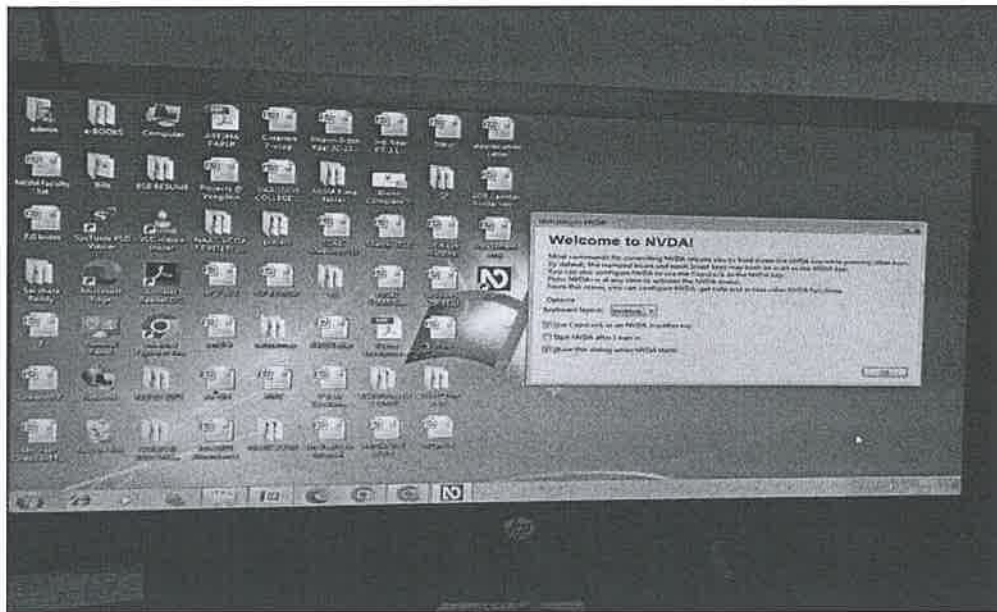
NVDA (Non Visual Desktop Access) Screen Reader use with computer running on windows, it helps for blind or visually impaired people.
