Best Practice 1

1. Title of the Practice: Adverse Drug Reaction (ADR) reporting and Clinical Pharmacist activities are practically implemented in our college

2. Objectives:

- ✓ Detecting, assessing, understanding and reporting of Adverse Drug Reactions (ADRs) to the AMC, KMC, under PvPI.
- ✓ Educate the students for direct contact with the patient health care system and endorsed to take critical decisions at prescribed medications in inpatient prescription.
- ✓ Train the students for clinical pharmacist activities like ward round participation, patient counselling, pharmacist's intervention, drug information, medication chart review, drug interaction, therapeutic drug monitoring, medication history interview (MHI), case reports and dispensing of medicines in dispensary.

3. Context:

The dream of our college is to generate competently skilled pharmacy professionals who will confidently impact healthcare in society. The students are trained for pharmacist activities like ward round participation, patient counselling, pharmacist intervention, drug information, Adverse Drug Reactions (ADRs), medication chart review, drug interaction, Therapeutic Drug Monitoring, case reports and dispensing of medicines in dispensary.

There were many incidents where our faculty and students returned to the institute due to non co-operation from hospital authorities.



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


Students Dispensing Medicines in Dispensary




Medication Chart Review






Medication History Interview Sessions




Pharmacist Interventions






Patient Counselling



Best Practice 2

1. Title of the Practice: Academic Profile Monitoring

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- A. To maintain records of students' attendance, results from tests, course materials, sessions for counselling, and curricular, co-curricular, and academic accomplishments.
- B. To upload the corresponding subject's lesson plans. With the use of this lesson plan, professors may complete the curriculum within the allotted time while ensuring that students are ready for class and the lab.
- C. To discuss each student's performance with parents during Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM) and as and when required.
- D. To continuously encourage and support students in achieving ranks at various levels.
- E. To facilitate the distribution and exchange of information and ideas amongst the students.
- F. To initiate, implement, and obtain projects and activities that will help the institution.
- G. To monitor the students from the training to accomplishment of the course and drive them in their area of interest accordingly to fulfil their Professional dreams and get placed in their interested area after stepping out from this institute.

3. Context

The importance of curriculum topics, systematic planning and effective teaching developed interest of students in the subject which improved overall attendance of students and enhanced learning process in them. The teaching lesson plan of the subject



by the teacher makes delivery of syllabus easy and provides idea to the teacher for effective teaching.

The formation of **Student activity cell** increased the involvement of students in the affairs of the institution, in cooperation with the teachers.

4. The Practice

The monitoring system at every level includes like the efficient implementation of academic planning, coordination of co-curricular and extracurricular activities, coverage of the syllabus, student attendance and academic progress, etc. A teacher is assigned as a faculty advisor who coordinates with the students to arrange various activities. HODs along with the faculty advisor create a team of student coordinators. After the formation of a student chapter, the activities are planned for a semester. While making plans different suggestions from students and faculty members are considered in a meeting.

Academic Monitoring committee assesses each and every aspect related to the student and gives inputs at every step to help the students achieve their goals.

5) Evidence of success

The entire academic monitoring system has been highly effective in raising the standard of instructions given to the students. It has demonstrated a significant improvement in students' self-discipline, regularity, punctuality and sincerity about their studies when paired with other activities to shape their whole personalities. The rapport between students and teachers has improved and students now feel comfortable approaching teachers with their difficulties. The results showed that student involvement in co-curricular and extracurricular activities was on the rise.

6) Problems encountered and resources required

A few students who came from nearby villages were unable to reach the college on time due to the delays in public transport system, at times.

A few students did not find themselves comfortable to come forward and talk about their problems. The teachers talked to them in convincing manner and made them feel at home. Counseling of the students on a regular basis is required to make them feel free to communicate and participate in the activities of their choice.
